 - **The Decennial Census** the once-a-decade population and housing count of the United States
 - **The American Community Survey** the ongoing annual survey of the nation's population
 - **The Census of Governments** identifies the scope and nature of the nation's state and local government sector
 - **The Economic Census** the official five-year measure of American business
- Our mission is to serve as the leading source of quality data about America's people, places, and economy.



The American Community Survey is on the leading edge of survey design, continuous improvement, and data quality


- The nation's most current, reliable, and accessible data source for local statistics on critical planning topics such as age, children, veterans, commuting, education, income, and employment
- Surveys **3.5 million** households and informs over **\$675 billion** of Federal government spending each year
 - Visit 20,000 Group Quarter facilities and sample approximately 194,000 residents each year
- Covers 35+ topics, supports over 300 evidence-based Federal government uses, and produces 11 billion estimates each year
- Three key annual data releases:
 - 1-year Estimates (for large populations)
 - 1-year Supplemental Estimates (for small populations)
 - 5-year Estimates (for very small populations)








Geographic Area Relationships— Small Statistical Areas




Longitudinal Employer-Household Dynamics (LEHD)

What is LEHD?

Until recently, many interactions between workers and firms were unobservable because there existed no link between employer and household data in the U.S. statistical system.

Since 1999 the Longitudinal Employer-Household Dynamics (LEHD) program at the U.S. Census Bureau has sought to fill this gap in the nation's statistical infrastructure by building a comprehensive database of longitudinally linked jobs data. The potential uses of the LEHD jobs data are far-reaching, both for unraveling important economic questions and for the provision of new statistical products.






Where Do the Data Come From?

- Local Employment Dynamics (LED) Partnership
 - Begun in late 1990s with a few states
 - Some states have time series back to 1990 (AZ goes back to 2004)
 - Not currently producing data for *Alaska, Puerto Rico, and Virgin Islands



Local Employment Dynamics: Public Use Data Products



The Quarterly Workforce Indicators (QWI)

- Employment
- Job Creation, Job Destruction, Hires, Separations, Turnover
- By industry, county, CBSA, state, Workforce Investment Area (WIA) and worker characteristics

Job-to-Job Flows (J2J)

 Traces worker movement through industries, geographic labor markets, and to/from employment

OnTheMap/LEHD Origin-Destination Employment Statistics (LODES)

- Employment at the Census block level by where workers live and work
- Popular uses local economic development, business site selection, and emergency planning




- ✓ Experimental tabulations
- Earnings and employment outcomes for college & university graduates by degree level, degree major, and post-secondary institution.
- Sate-of-the-art confidentiality protection mechanisms to protect the underlying data
- Data sharing partnerships between universities, university systems, State DOE, State Labor Market Information offices, and the U.S. Census Bureau
- Data are currently only available for post-graduate institutions whose transcript data has been made available to Census Bureau through a data-sharing agreement (Texas, Colorado, Michigan, &

Wisconsin)




Download Public-Use Data
